Year in Review

E Prep and Village Prep Willard, located in the Cudell neighborhood, offers families a needed educational choice on Cleveland's west side.

The campus currently serves grades K-3 and 5-7, and will grow to fully serve K-8 at capacity. Teachers and leaders are deeply committed to setting scholars on an early pathway to college, with a curriculum emphasizing academic proficiency and a school culture meant to develop personal characteristics like determination, grit, and responsibility. Built upon through elementary and middle school, this preparatory foundation serves Willard scholars through high school, college, and beyond.



Volunteers from the Progressive Corporation helped scholars solve puzzles and write hundreds of lines of code at our "Hour of Code" event.



Kindergartners got personal with some special visitors, thanks to Scales and Tails handlers who delivered a hands on introduction to the characteristics and habitats of reptiles.



E Prep fifth and sixth graders took a community service trip to the Cleveland Food Bank. Fifth graders helped sort nonperishable food to be donated to shelters for the holidays, and sixth graders made bagged lunches to be sent to women's shelters.



Village Prep families coordinated their outfits and danced the day away at the first annual "Ties and Tiaras" family dance. E Prep was also in a party mood at the 80's Flashback, bringing the whole school together for friendship and fun.
