**Citizens Academy East (CAE) and Citizens Leadership Academy East (CLAE), located on one campus on the east end of Glenville, develop students in grades K-8 for academic achievement, leadership, and active citizenship.**

CAE offers a core K-5 curriculum that interweaves a citizenship focus encouraging virtues like respect, responsibility, a no-excuses culture and deep understanding of the citizen's role in the community.

Students then move to CLAE for grades 6-8, an EL middle school combining core academic study and experiential learning. Case study work is rooted in essential questions exploring what it means to be a civic leader in Cleveland, and students apply what they learn through various community projects or experiences.
