Acceleration Strategy

We use a blend of small group instruction and computer-based learning to accelerate student learning to drive student academic growth. Students rotate through small groups to receive instruction at their level through a curriculum that best suits their individual needs, and iReady instruction.

To identify the appropriate acceleration strategy and curriculum, teachers will utilize screening tools to determine why the student is struggling. Once they understand why they can match the curriculum and strategy to the need. Teachers will then engage in ongoing data collection and analysis to adjust the intervention as the scholar's needs shift throughout the year.

KEY INFORMATION

Attendance + Visitation

The primary responsibility for a scholar's attendance rests with their guardian(s). Guardian(s) must call or email the school to inform the school that their child is absent. Upon return to school, the scholar must provide to the school a written statement from a guardian stating the cause for absence or the absence will be considered unexcused.

Late Arrival and Early Dismissal Related to Absences

Scholars must arrive on time (8:00 am) and to stay at school until the very end of the day (2:15 pm). Late arrivals and early pickups are tracked by the minute and will be deducted from their scholar's hourly attendance time. This means if you drop off 30 minutes late or pick up 30 minutes early, 0.5 hours will be added to their absent hours.

A scholar is truant if the scholar is absent for 72 total hours of unexcused time (or about 11 school days) or more in one school year."Under Ohio state law, we are required to refer families whose scholars are habitually truant to the Cuyahoga County Juvenile Court. You can avoid this by ensuring your scholar is at school on time, every day, and stays the whole day!

Visitor Policy

All visitors MUST report to the Main Office upon arrival and sign in and provide a valid ID. Since it is difficult to conduct an impromptu meeting without notice, we also ask that you do the following:

- Call to schedule your visit 24 hours in advance with the Principal or your child's teacher.
- Teachers will be unable to meet with you during their teaching time.
- Plan to stay for 30 minutes to 60 minutes at maximum. Visit only your child's designated class.
- Wear the visitor's pass in a clearly visible area.
- Turn your cell phone to silent if entering the classroom.
- If you would like to speak again with a teacher following your visit, please contact them by phone or call the school to set up a follow-up meeting.

Lunch + Recess

- All students in grades K-8 have a lunch break for 25 minutes daily.
- Students in grades K-4 have recess for 25 minutes daily.

KEY INFORMATION

Uniforms

Uniforms are purchased through our uniform provider Schoolbelles. Uniform shirt and pant colors vary by which school your scholar attends. You can purchase online, from the store, or by returning the order form to the school's main office by July 10th. The order form is located on the next page of this packet.

The uniform policy is enforced every day, Monday - Friday. Any scholar who arrives at school out of uniform may receive a phone call home. Guardians may be asked to bring the missing uniform item to school. Scholars may receive a consequence or be assigned Reflection/Detention for being out of uniform. Scholars that are consistently out of uniform may receive further disciplinary consequences. If you need financial support attaining uniform pieces, please contact our Family Hotline at 216-302-0591.

Generally, scholars at BPS should avoid the following to be in compliance with the dress code:

- Sweatpants, blue jeans, or leggings
- Sweatshirts that cover the school uniform top
- Sandals or open-toed shoes
- Hats and hoods
- · Carry cell phones or other electronic devices on their person during the school day
